

## CMC & CMC Recycling - Proud of our contributions



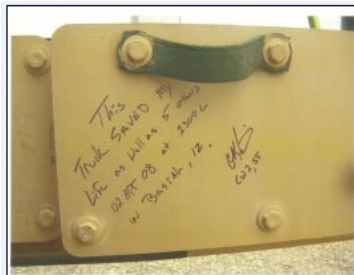
CMC Steel South Carolina provided steel that was used to rebuild the Pentagon after the September 11 attacks.

“Last night, I chatted online with one of my good childhood friend, Rey Ado, who I have known since the 7<sup>th</sup>



grade. He is active duty with the Army, and has been deployed in Iraq for the last 15 months. Two weeks ago, he was riding in an RG33, 6x6, and got hit by an EFP. The vehicle flipped over but no one was killed or seriously hurt. One guy broke his arm, and another his leg. Rey walked away with a couple of bruised ribs and a bruised leg. He said that the RG worked so well, and that he was back in the gym shortly after. He wanted to thank us for

the RG33 and it saved his life.

He said, “u can tell your people how much of a difference you have made from a first hand story”.

In FY 2009, CMC Recycling processed almost 3 million tons of scrap metal -- that's almost 6 billion pounds of material that was kept out of landfills, off roadsides, and out of your neighbor's front yard. Six billion pounds of scrap metal is equivalent to a line of school buses 1300-miles long. ...from Dallas, TX to El Paso, TX - and back again!
